CARRYING ON THE TRADITION

Mikvah is a pillar in every Jewish community, and has been since Temple times; the Talmud tells us that if a community can afford only one building it should build a mikvah! Today, standing on the shoulders of the dedicated founders and leaders who built the past Mikvahs in Columbus, our task is to assure that the new building will serve the entire Jewish community for generations to come.

There is a long and rich history of Mikvah in Columbus dating back to 1896, when the first Mikvah was built in the basement of Agudas Achim located at 464 S Fifth Street, on the southeast side of Columbus. From 1906- 1937 the Mikvah was located at 337 Donaldson Street. In 1938, a Mikvah was built and opened at 950 E Livingston Avenue. In 1970, under the direction of Rabbi David Stavsky, OBM, a Mikvah was built in the basement of Beth Jacob Synagogue on College Avenue.

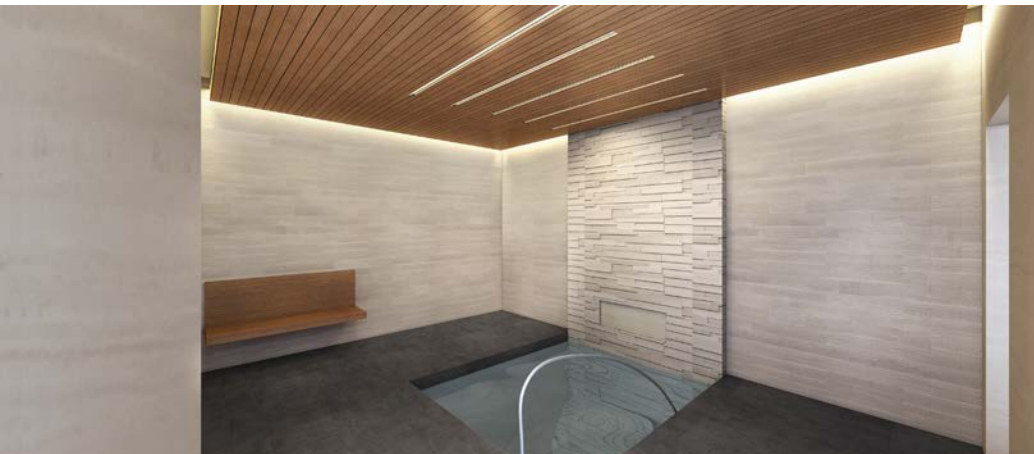

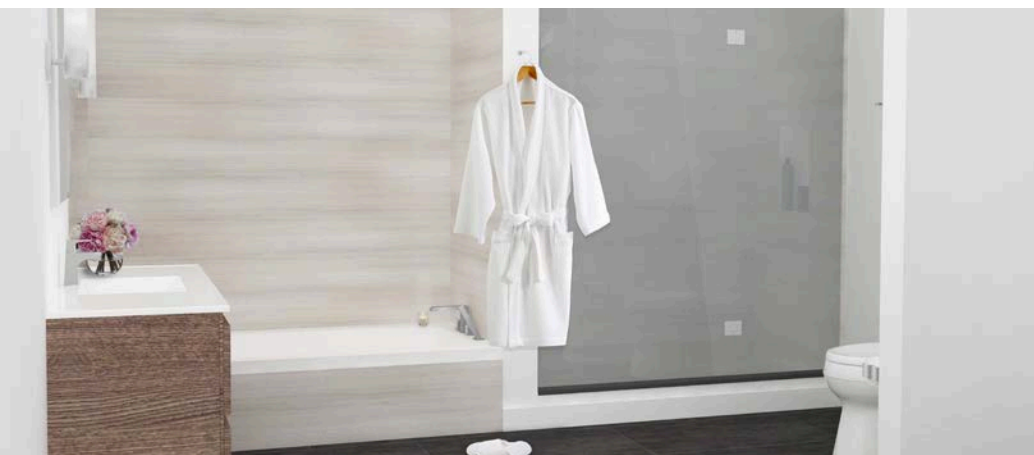
Mikvah Exterior
